JULIAND FAMILY PROGRAM IN SMITHVILLE FLATS

On Friday, September 16, Peg Ross and Claudia Kachmarik will give a joint PowerPoint presentation at the Community Center in Smithville Flats. Sponsored by the Smithville Historical Society, the program at 5285 Route 41 will begin at 7:00 p.m.

Joseph Juliand settled in Greene in 1798 when Smithville hadn't yet been formed; the town as we know it now was the northern part of the just-formed Town of Greene.

Peg Ross, Greene Town Historian, will discuss Juliand's life in France, why he came to Greene, and how the family left its mark on the community.

Claudia Kachmarik, proprietor of the 1810 Juliand House Bed and Breakfast, will concentrate on the house that Joseph built in 1810. She'll describe the house's many rooms, how the house was used during its years of Juliand ownership, and its transformation into a bed and breakfast. The home will be included in the Greene Historical Society's village house tour on Saturday,

December 10.
